Key Note Speech: Democratization of the Muslim World

Cem Özdemir

Mr. Özdemir was born 21 December 1965 in Bad Urach. He is a German politician of Turkish descent, and a Member of the European Parliament for Alliance '90/The Greens, part of the European Greens. Özdemir has been a member of the German Green Party since 1981. From 1989 to 1994, he was a member of the Party's regional council for the federal state of Baden-Württemberg. He was elected to the Bundestag in 1994. From 1998 until 2002, Özdemir was the Green Party's Parliamentary Spokesman on Domestic Affairs and chairman of the German-Turkish Parliamentary Group. Özdemir has written 2 books - "Currywurst und Döner – Integration in Deutschland" and an autobiography - "Ich bin Inländer".

New Approaches to Development [PANEL I]

Inge Kaul

Dr. Kaul most recently served as Special Policy Advisor at the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in New York. Before that she was Director of UNDP's Office of Development Studies, and from 1989 to 1994, Director of UNDP's Human Development Report Office. Her areas of specialization are public finance/economics, risk management, the financing of international cooperation, public-private partnering and global governance. She is currently teaching an elective at the Hertie School.

Jan Martin Witte

Dr. Witte is Associate Director of the Global Public Policy Institute (GPPi) and also Managing Director of GPPi Consulting. His areas of expertise include international development, humanitarian action, reform of multilateral organizations, and non-state actors in global governance. His experience includes consulting and research assignments at the Brookings Institution (Washington, D.C.), the Corporate Strategy Group of the World Bank (Washington, D.C.), the Office of Development Studies of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and the Private Sector Partnership Unit of the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS), New York. Jan Martin holds a Ph.D. and M.A. in International Relations and International Economics from the Nitze School of Advanced International Studies of Johns Hopkins University.

Monika Lücke

Dr. Lücke is the Project Officer for GTZ's cross-sectoral "Realising Human Rights in Development Cooperation". In this capacity, she developed a support programme for the nascent African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights. Before this she worked in positions **for the Protestant Church in Germany (EKD) in Brussels in Berlin**. From 1996 to 1999, she was Assistant Professor of International Law at the University of Dresden. She is also registered with the German roster for International Election Observers.

Robert Marten (Moderator)

Robert most recently interned with the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS) in Nairobi, Kenya and Monrovia, Liberia. Before starting his MPP, he worked in Burma and Vietnam. Robert holds a BA (Honours History and Political Science) from McGill University in Montreal, Canada.

Günter Bormann

Mr. Bormann studied law and practiced from 1984 -1991. In 1991 he joined the public service. Since 1993 he works for the Federal Commissioner for Stasi-files. From 1993 to 2001, he served as head of department, and since 2002 he serves as head of the secretariat for the Federal Commissioner Marianne Birthler, and is responsible for legal and international affairs. In 2004, he received a Kellogg-WHU MBA.

Andrei Pippidi

Prof. Pippidi is professor for Modern History at the University of Bucharest and director of the Romanian Institute for Recent History since 2000. He studied in Bucharest and Cluj and did his D. Phil at Oxford University in 1985. Prof. Pippidi participates in the panel in his function as a Member of the Romanian Presidential Commission for Holocaust Crime and of the Romanian Presidential Commission for the Investigation of Communist Abuses.

H.E. Eugène-Richard Gasana

Mr. Gasana has been the Rwanda's Ambassador in Germany (as well as Austria, Bulgaria, Federation of Russia, Hungary, Poland, Czech Republic and Romania) since April 2004. Until 2002 he was Permanent Representative for Rwanda to the United Nations. At the same time, he held the position as Chairman of the Group of African Ambassadors. In May 2005, he was appointed Alternate Governor ad hoc at the 40th Annual Meeting of the African Development Bank during the election of the new President of the Bank.

Henry Haaker (Moderator)

Henry studied Philosophy and German Literature at Humboldt University in Berlin, Sorbonne in Paris and Washington University in St Louis. He worked in the German Bundestag, various NGOs and is currently most active with the NGO, Humanity in Action.

Public Private Partnership as Governance Model for Everything? *[Panel III]*

Kaija Landsberg

Ms. Landsberg is CEO of "Teach First Deutschland (TFD)", a social profit organization aiming to overcome educational inequality by recruiting and training top graduates of all academic backgrounds to place them as teachers in Germany's most challenging schools. TFD is based on the successful models Teach For America and Teach First UK. Kaija holds a MPP degree from the Hertie School.

Christoph Baron

Mr. Brown is director of Arvato government services (a department within Arvato direct services AG), which aims at opening up the German market for public and local services. Dr. Baron studied Economics and got his PhD at Technische Universität Berlin. He started his career at Siemens, and later switched to Accenture, where he worked as a consultant mainly for clients from the public sector.

Jobst Fiedler

Mr. Fiedler serves as the Hertie School's Associate Dean and teaches in the field of Public Management and Finance. Besides having held executive positions within the City State of Hamburg, having been member of several working groups of the OECD and the EU, and acting as the executive mayor of the city of Hanover, he has also worked as managing partner for the Strategy Consultants Roland Berger.
