Sebastian Dworack is an external consultant associated with the Global Public Policy Institute in Berlin. Sebastian studied Political Science, International Relations and Law, History and Philosophy at the Universities of Munich and Edinburgh and received his M.A. in Political Science from the University of Bonn in 2001.



Sebastian has worked as researcher and lecturer on international relations and EU integration at the University of Bonn, before he joined the European Union Monitoring Mission (EUMM) on the Balkans in 2002, where he worked as a political analyst and reporter. Between 2005 and 2007 Sebastian worked as chief political advisor for the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe's (OSCE) Mission to Skopje, Macedonia. His main areas of engagement included policy and strategy advice in the field of conflict prevention and post-conflict rehabilitation, Good Governance and Institutional Reforms as well as Minority Rights. He served as international election observer and supervisor for the Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) and the European Union in Kosovo, Macedonia, Serbia, Montenegro and Bosnia-Herzegovina. Since 2008, Sebastian works as an independent consultant for security and public policy and development cooperation. He also pursues his post-graduate studies in conflict mediation and coaching at the University of Potsdam.
